THE TITTLESHALL PARISH COUNCIL FOOTPATH REPORT TUESDAY 5TH MARCH 2024

FOOTPATH TWO starts at the bridge off Church Lane with the public right of way beginning on the left almost immediately and crossing diagonally to join with FOOTPATH ONE that then leads to Godwick Farm. The public right of way across FOOTPATH TWO has at present a grass crop with no visible reinstated path. There is a permissive path installed by the landowner which runs along the right field edge, and at the top turns at a right angle to the left and joins with FOOTPATH ONE which leads to the English Heritage Medieval village.

FOOTPATH FOUR has its entrance opposite Manor Farm on the Fakenham Road, and leads past the animal enclosure and joins with FOOTPATH ONE at the moat, these footpaths have not, for this report, been inspected by me.

FOOTPATH FIVE runs from Back Lane through the farm yard of High House Farm and is always kept clear.

The path then leads into FOOTPATH SEVEN which is the Old Cricket Pitch and that ends at the Stanfield Road near Peelings Coach garage. FOOTPATH SEVEN crosses a grass field with the path clearly worn and visible.

FOOTPATH SIX is found on the right hand side of the road out of the village toward Litcham and ends

at the solar farm on the back road leading to Litcham. The initial track is hard core so is usable all year round. The second part of the path narrows to grass with an electric fence on the right running the length

and a hedge on the left. The fence is activated only when livestock are in the field.

The hedge has been trimmed so this particular part is walkable.
FOOTPATH EIGHT branches off Back Lane at Cokesford Cottage.
This is a wide Public Path and is clear to walk being regularly used by farm vehicles.

FOOTPATH TEN is a continuation of FOOTPATH EIGHT and this clear and wide to walk ending at the road to Mileham

FOOTPATH THREE is located on the Stanfield Road out of the village on the left. The path itself has always been clear but is now upgraded to an all weather shingle path running its length and will lead the walker to Whissonsett. The signpost however, has died and lies in the ditch. It has snapped off at the base due to rot and old age.

FOOTPATH NINE is accessed along the Stanfield Road at Wicken Farm and is on the right side of the road. The path is clear to see from the road and is visible and firm underfoot due to what seems to be regular farm machinery using it.

The path direction goes partway to Mileham but the continuation track is clear to walk.

There is no signpost indicating right of way at this footpath.
