THE TITTLESHALL PARISH COUNCIL FOOTPATH REPORT TUESDAY 5TH JULY 2022

The entrance to FOOTPATH TWO starts at the crossing of the wooden bridge on Church Lane with the public right of way running across the field to merge with FOOTPATH FOUR. These two paths then combine to form FOOTPATH ONE which leads up to Godwick Farm.

FOOTPATH TWO runs through the crop which has been re-instated and is walkable, albeit somewhat narrow. The entrance over the bridge is overgrown though not impassable but the permissive walk instituted by the landowner is completely overgrown and totally obscured.

This permissive path continues to be un-walkable along the field edge right the way up to the joining with FOOTPATH ONE which leads into the Godwick field, where the public right of way has been re-instated enabling the walk to continue up to the farm itself.

FOOTPATH FOUR starts opposite Manor Farm on the road leading out of Tittleshall toward Fakenham and leads into FOOTPATH ONE which in turn leads up to the Godwick Farm site of the English Heritage Medieval Village ruins. The entrance to the public right of way is overgrown and overhung with branches. The path itself is densely overgrown and impassable.

FOOTPATH FIVE which runs through the farmyard at High House Farm is clear and passable.

FOOTPATH SIX is located on the right of the road leading from Tittleshall toward Litcham and ends on the back road leading to Litcham at the solar panel installation. The beginning of the wide path is hardcore which becomes a grass path that narrows and runs beside an electric fence. That part of the path, which is a narrow to begin with is made more so with a hedge that needs cutting back and a pathway obscured by long grass.

FOOTPATH THREE out of the village and off the road towards Stanfield is clear and well maintained all the way to Whissonsett.

FOOTPATH NINE again off the Stanfied Road at Wicken Farm remains clear and well maintained.

FOOTPATH EIGHT branches off Back Lane at Cokesford Cottage and then becomes FOOTPATH TEN which ends at the Mileham Road.

The path is tractor wide and is always clear right the way to the Mileham Road.
