

THE TITTLESHALL PARISH COUNCIL FOOTPATH REPORT FOR TUESDAY THE 4TH OF NOVEMBER 2025

FOOTPATH TWO has its entrance on Church Lane over a wooden bridge. The right of way is a diagonal path across the field which at this time has not been re-instated. The field is fallow and is covered with a mixture of clover and grass, however there is a semblance of a path worn by committed walkers. The path is thin but can be seen. The permissive path initiated by the landowner is wide and walkable if a little stubbly underfoot. If the footpath were to be re-instated it would circumvent the moat and join with **FOOTPATH ONE** which becomes a single path leading up to the remaining ruins of the English Heritage Medieval village of Godwick. Halfway up this path there should be a re-instated diagonal path across the field, and my apologies but I was not able to verify whether the path had been re-instated.

FOOTPATH FOUR starts opposite Manor Farm on the Fakenham Road. The entrance at this autumn time of year is clear to walk and leads down to the moat passing through the plantation and joining with **FOOTPATH ONE**. This path has been cut clear and wide to walk, there has also been some serious hedge cutting.

FOOTPATH FIVE runs from Back Lane through to the farm yard of High House Farm and is at present clear to walk. It should be noted that the Mary and Paul Osborne no longer manage the farm and as far as can be seen that management has reverted back to the owners. The path leaves the farm yard and leads onto **FOOTPATH SEVEN** which in bygone times was the Old Cricket Pitch. The path across is clear to walk but at this present time runs beside an area that has been fenced off for sheep to graze. If walking you are quite close to the fencing and which I could not discern if it was electrified. The path exits at the beginning of the Stanfield Road near the premises of Peelings Coach Company.

FOOTPATH SIX can be found on the right of the road leading out of the village toward Litcham and ends on the road where the solar farm installation is sited. The first part of the public right of way is hardcore and is kept clear by the use heavy farm equipment using the track for access to the fields. The second part narrows to grass and is electrically fenced along its length and which is only live when cattle are in the field. The grass is longish and there is overhang on the hedges but the path is discernible.

FOOTPATH EIGHT branches of Back Lane at Cokesford Cottage and the right of way path is clear and kept so by the use of tractors and farm vehicles.

FOOTPATH TEN is a continuation of **FOOTPATH EIGHT** and is clear to walk ending at the road to Mileham.

FOOTPATH ELEVEN branches off from **FOOTPATH EIGHT** and exits further along the road to Mileham and is walkable.

FOOTPATH THREE is located along the Stanfield Road out of the village and on the left near Wicken Farm. The entrance is over a well built wooden bridge into the field. The path has not been re-instated and there appears to be a growing crop in the field. If the path were to be reinstated then walkers would be able to get to Whissonsett. The signpost has been re-planted! on the other side of the path entrance and is now clearly visible.

FOOTPATH NINE is also accessed along the Stanfield Road but is on the right. The path is clear and wide, if a little bumpy and leads to Mileham. The signpost is now upright!
